

Preparation step by step:

1. Think of a COUNTRY you would like to visit.
2. Research for the most interesting and essential information that an average tourist would like to find out about it. Consider the following:
 - main geographical aspects;
 - main historical aspects;
 - political system and current rulers;
 - religion;
 - landscape, climate;
 - landmarks and popular destinations;

- currency;
- a phrasebook of native language(s);
- map(s);
- travel advice (airports, routes, hiring a car, etc.);
- types of accommodation;
- tourist attractions, things to do and see;
- popular entertainment;
- popular sport(s);
- prices;
- why is English official there?
- etc.

3. Create a **TABLE OF CONTENTS** containing included information (number the pages).
4. Create a **BIBLIOGRAPHY** including the sources you have used (books, encyclopedias, atlases, websites with links).

What counts is: the effort put to make your guidebook interesting, clear to follow, coherent, neat and correct.
